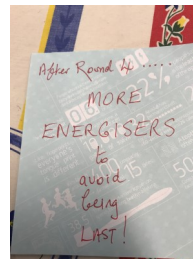

We all wish her a 'Fun Fellowship and Friendship' time with us here at Kawana Waters!



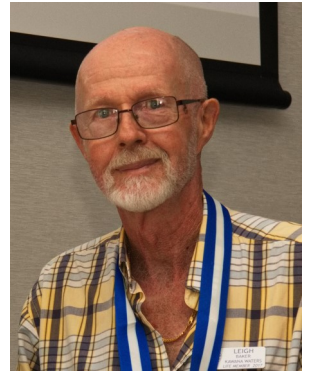

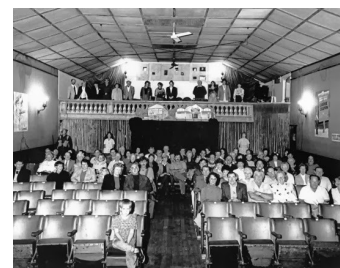
Built in 1921, the curtains of the Majestic first parted for stage plays, concerts and even boxing matches before it was licensed to show silent films in 1923.



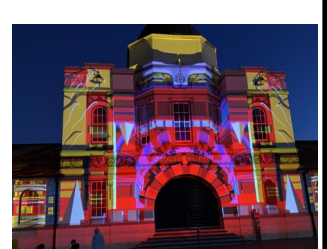
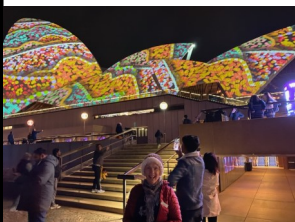
In the five years to June 2001 over 106,758 trees and native plants were planted in conjunction with various land care volunteer groups, and the equivalent of over 7000 wheely bins full of weeds were cleared and composted from various project sites.

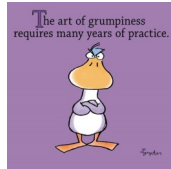
