Guest Speaker: Professor Peter Ellis MA, MB, BChir, FRCPA, FACLM, FFFLM Forensic Pathologist



Our guest speaker Ellis, commenced his medical training at Cambridge University & completed his pathology training in Australia (Queensland & South Australia). A significant part of his professional life was spent as Director of Forensic Medicine at Westmead Sydney 91988—2006). In late 2006 Peter moved to Nambour Hospital until late 2016 when he “retired” or rather went into semi retirement.

Noted for his work in Disaster Victim Identification (DVI) Peter has been involved in Queensland based disasters, Victorian Bushfire, the first Bali bombing & 2004 Tsunami in Thailand. The aftermath of the Tsunami resulted in Peter leading the establishment of the first formal mortuary in Thailand. In addition to Peter’s hands on involvement in current disasters, he has been involved in the identification & recovery of bodies from the mass graves in Fromelles in northern France. Many of us who lost loved ones during WWI can directly appreciate his work in DVI.

Whilst Peter indicated that he retired in late 2016, he is still actively involved in an advisory role as a member of Interpol’s DVI working group. Peter also advises the ABC in the production of “Harrow”. Additionally he is Adjunct Professor in Forensic Medicine & Pathology at Griffith University & holds a similar title at QUT.

Personal Profile Alan & Jenny Newbound

Alan was born in Barnawartha, which is 25km south of Albury-Wodonga in 1936 & is the 4th youngest of eleven siblings. Whilst describing his upbringing on a small land holding as a simple life, the multi tasking skills he acquired in completing daily tasks no doubt have assisted him in later life. Primary school location, (200 yards from home) ensured his regular attendance. Whilst walking to school was the norm for primary school, it was soon replaced by long bus trips for secondary school.

When Alan turned fourteen, he commenced a six year apprenticeship at Border Morning Mail newspaper as a composite & linotype operator. During this apprenticeship Alan completed a six month stint in the Navy as part of his National Service.

1958 marked the start of Alan's life in Wagga Wagga & eventually his marriage to Jenny. They meet at the Daily Advertiser, Jenny worked in the advertising department. 1961 marked Alan's appointment to Night Production Foreman. The purchase of their first home was made possible by the sale of Alan's car & funds he had saved. Buying, developing & selling four properties over a 54 year period before moving to the Sunshine Coast to be closer to their arried daughter who lives in Toowomba & the warmer weather.

Whilst Jenny might have worked in advertising when she & Alan met, her artistic skills are highly recognised in a number of artshows she has held. Her artistic skills combined with a green thumb & hasd manual labour (both Jenny & Alan) resulted in their 200 acre residence in Wagga being part of the ABC Open Garden Scheme & multiple requests to sell the property.

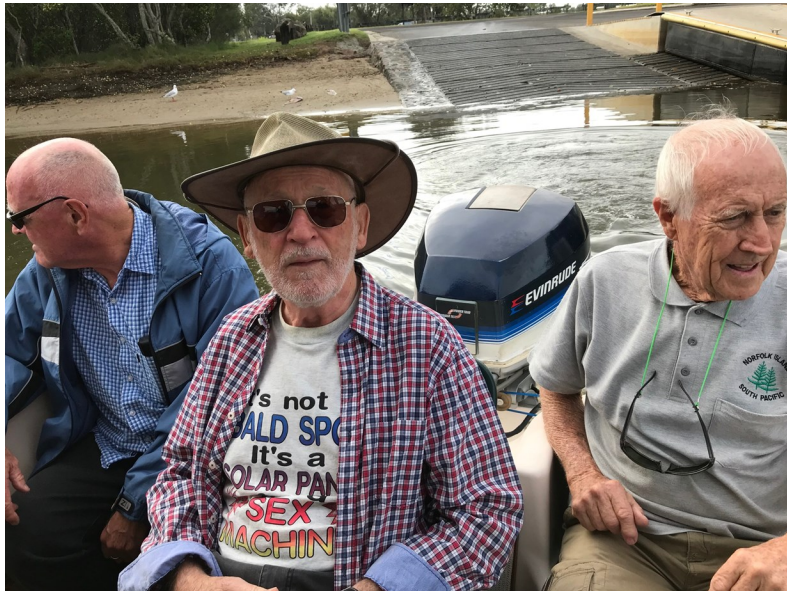

Grumpy Old Men Outing

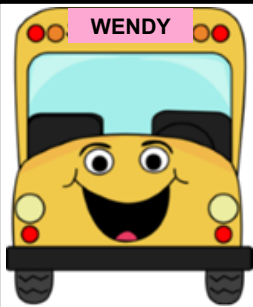


On Thursday 13th June “Four saucy sea dogs” joined Captain Brian on the Maroochy River.
